E-CLUB ONE — HOW TO MAKE-UP

1. Review one or more of the current programs on home page OR chose one or more of the Past (archived) programs. You will be required to answer questions. There is space on the makeup request form for up to three articles to be reviewed.

2. After completing program(s) click on Make-up Request Form from the drop-down menu at top of page OR the bottom of each make-up program.

Read Makeup Request Form carefully, and follow instructions. A Make-Up Form will appear once you press the SUBMIT button (one time only) and an email copy will be sent to the email address you provided.

3. PRINT YOUR MAKE-UP FORM

Once your make-up appears, if you know the email address, you can also click on File, Send and email a copy to your club secretary.

Note From eClub One Webmaster...

It is recommended that Rotarians spend at least 30 minutes for a make-up. Not all articles take 30 minutes to review. More than one article can be reviewed to meet this time recommendation. As always, Rotarians should apply the 4-Way Test to the time they spend on the eClub One site for a make-up.

To get E-Club, enter the Longmont Rotary Web Site, select Rotary District 5450 from the drop down menu, then under popular links, select e-club one makeup. Or just enter the following URL in your browser. <http://www.rotaryclubone.org/>
