Clay is a Colorado native having grown up and attended school in Boulder. He interrupted school for seven years while he worked as a cowboy. After returning to school he majored in Journalism. He worked for the Los Angeles times, the Orange County Register and from 1993 to 2007, the Daily Camera. Prior to coming to the Daily Camera he worked for a brief time as an adoption Counselor for the Longmont Humane Society.

The New Longmont Humane Society building , now under construction will provide:

- Innovative accommodations for dogs, cats birds and small mammals, improving the quality of shelter life.
- New adoption promenades for dogs and cats, enhancing the way visitors and animals interact.
- Greatly increased shelter capacity, allowing for future growth.
- Multiple , separately ventilated quarantine areas for better disease control.
- A new spray and neuter clinic.
- De-centralized animal service areas, improving staff efficiency in care of shelter animals.
- Enhanced public lobby and information kiosks, meeting room, resource library and retail store.
